2:00 P.M. Presentation by genealogist Barry Finkel

Speaker, Barry Finkel, is corresponding secretary of JGSI and often volunteers at the monthly meeting's help desk. He is a retired IT systems administrator who wrote his first computer program in 1966. Barry started in genealogy in the mid-1960s, then put it aside. In 1991 one of Barry's brothers decided to put their genealogy into a computer database, and today the file of his genealogy and his brother's wife's genealogy has over 6,400 persons.

Barry's presentation will cover a brief history of his Hershberg family in Chicago and South Bend, Indiana — discussing two mysteries that he eventually solved, and he will explain the solutions. He will also discuss one mystery that remains unsolved.
