What the New Year Holds in Store for Us

Another year has passed in the history of our organization and it is with regret that we note that the English Speaking Department has not made any strides forward during this year. It is easy to find excuses for our failure to accomplish the things we set out to do, and in that manner justify our lack of organizational responsibility.



I am mindful of the fact that 1940 has been a bad year for organizational work among the youth of America due to the fact that the conscription issue became the dominant question in the early months of the year and the average person, facing military service, is not prone to join fraternal organizations. However, there are other factors of equal importance conducive to organizational work. With the collapse of Poland and the Western European states, the problem of the Jew became the dominant issue for every thinking person, particularly among those young men and women who had been exposed to libertarian ideas.

While it is needless, and impossible in this short article, to describe the plight of the Jew throughout Europe, it is, however, necessary to emphasize the very precarious situation of those who had been leaders in Jewish activities and particularly in Jewish labor and radical political movements. The execution of thousands of those who had been active in behalf of the Jewish workers, particularly in Poland, and the need for organizational support, as well as building a powerful organization in this country, should have become manifestly clear in the minds of thousands of young men and women and make them material for our organization which has stayed steadfast during these many years to its principles and has acted as the Red Cross of the Jewish labor movement.

The fact that our Youth and English speaking organization has not grown is due primarily,

in my opinion, to the fact that we have not realized our responsibility and made a serious effort to build a youth movement within the Workmen's Circle. The Workmen's Circle in Chicago has more than 3,000 members and there are at least 10,000 boys and girls, young men and women, sons and daughters of those members of the Workmen's Circle, who are eligible for membership in our organization, and it seems absurd that we should be compelled to seek members for the Youth and English Speaking Departments outside the Workmen's Circle when so much material is in our own ranks.

Several years ago we laid down a slogan which must be realized before the next convention of the Workmen's Circle if we are to go to that convention with a representative showing. The slogan is as follows: "One new member in the Youth and English Speaking Division for every member in the Workmen's Circle." Should we be able to accomplish this goal, we will go to the convention in 1941 with 3,000 new members in our organization.

We believe that this can be accomplished if each member will assume his responsibility in this work and realize that not only the future of the Workmen's Circle, but the future of the Jewish labor movement of America rests upon solidifying our ranks by training our youth to understand the ideals and organizational aspirations of our members who helped to build this powerful organization.

We appeal to the members of the Workmen's Circle of Chicago to give to the Youth Committee the names of their sons and daughters who are eligible for membership in our organization and we will assign them to the various groups according to their ages and build new groups whenever necessary in order to accomplish our goal of a youth movement worthy of Chicago.

Let us build together and present to the 1941 convention the fulfillment of our organizational hopes of the past years.

and who appreciate the significant role which the Workmen's Circle plays in Jewish life. These additional funds are secured by our annual campaign, known as the Yechidim Campaign, which climaxes its campaign at a final closing banquet held New Year's Eve, in one of the largest halls in Chicago, drawing a crowd of between 1,200 and 1,500, and every year we are unable to fulfill all demands for tickets.

The school and youth journal, which is now before you, reaches every member of our large Workmen's Circle family, who keep it the whole year round for information.

In glancing through these pages, you will see a mirror of all our activities. You will also find a fine representation of reputable business houses availing themselves of the great advertising value this magazine affords them. These advertisers not only popularize their merchandise or business, but are at the same time helping us educate a new generation, that will be a bulwark against intolerance of any form. Our school and youth movement are open to all parents who desire to give their children a progressive Jewish education, which will prepare them to be finer human beings and better Jews.

We wish to extend our thanks to all advertisers who have availed themselves of this opportunity to reach the organized Jewish folk masses of Chicago and we are certain that in the future increasingly large numbers of firms will be represented in this journal and avail themselves of our patronage.
